Welcome to term 4. Everyone seems to have had a good holiday and grown about 2 inches! This is a busy term with Kindy Orientation, Musica Viva, concert, reports, On Entry testing (PP), Christmas activities and class party. Before we know it, it will all be over. I will send home a note advising you of events, dates and requirements when I have a better idea myself.

Our Science theme this term is How Things Move. We will start our Christmas activities in November.

We have started the term in Maths learning about money and how to recognise coins using size, shape, colour, numbers and pictures.

In Language we have started with the Literature component of title, author, illustrator, characters, favourite part and sequence of events. We shared the big book "Sloppy Tiger Washes the Floor", which everyone enjoyed and had a laugh about.

Over the holidays I bought some capes for the children to wear throughout the day with the idea that when you have a cape on you have super powers to help you do your work. For those children who sometimes lack confidence and think they can't do something, wearing a cape will be a fun way of encouraging them to be more confident. This term our Science topic is Geology. We are going to be investigating rocks, soil, erosion and weathering. I am sending home a note to ask for collection of soil and rock samples. Our HASS (History and Social Sciences) topics are covering rules and laws and the three levels of Government and we are also going to be learning about Aboriginal culture and the impacts on Aboriginal people after colonisation.



I would like to remind you that home reading is such a powerful and beneficial way to enhance your child's education. Please support your child to read aloud to you every day and also read to them every day. You are never too old to be read to! 10 to 20 minutes a day is a good amount of time to allocate to enjoying books together. Reading to your child is the most important thing you can do to enhance their vocabulary, comprehension and imagination. Children need to incorporate many model texts to be able to become proficient writers, spellers and to comprehend complex themes in texts. Just read, read! It's also an opportunity to foster a close relationship with each other.
