Dear Parents & Families,

HALF WAY

It is hard to believe that we are now just over halfway through the term with December just around the corner. It is lovely to return to Walkaway for the last seven weeks of term and catch up with some familiar faces.

SAD NEWS

We have all been deeply saddened by the heartbreaking news we received on Monday morning regarding the passing of Tabitha Hamersley. I know that the school community will be thinking of the Hamersley family at this time and will be there to support and love them through this devastating time.

2020 PLANNING

As part of the planning process for 2020 staff have spent some time looking at 2019 NAPLAN results to identify learning focus areas to address in 2020 classroom programs. Sometimes we can identify gaps in a child's results as being the result of poor attendance (missing key sequences of lessons when concepts are taught and applied), learning difficulties, gaps in whole school programs or gaps in teacher planning & assessment. By taking advantage of our small student numbers we are able to look closely at individual students' NAPLAN results and identify areas of strength and weakness. Through this process staff have identified gaps in NAPLAN achievement that are common across year 3 & 5 and will be addressed in classroom programs in 2020; these areas include: increasing vocabulary, using calendars, timetables and maps, 3D shapes, working with informational texts, addressing common phonological weaknesses, improving the use of paragraphs in writing, using verb tense and including elaboration and detail in written work. I am looking forward to presenting this information in more detail to the school boar at the final meeting for the year in early December.

NCVISSA Summer Carnival

Students are looking forward to competing at the NCVISSA Summer Carnival on Friday. The carnival is a lot of work for staff and the parents who have volunteered their time to help out and transport students and I appreciate the effort from everyone. I am looking forward to a great day with some healthy competition. Bringing together several schools for a carnival is a big job and I hope that everyone attending will recognise the effort put in by our hosts Northampton District High School and support all teams positively.
